Instructional Innovation and Quality (13.5 FTE)

Instructional Innovation and Quality (IIQ) encompasses Academic Technology, Distance Education, Instructional Media Services, and the Online Course Improvement Program. The unit focuses on administration of, and support for, delivering education via non-traditional formats of ITV, online, and blended as well as sharing best practices in online education through presentations and workshops (instruction.nmsu.edu). See Appendix A .

IIQ supports New Mexico State University's strategic plan, Vision 20/20 (plan.nmsu.edu), benchmarks as follows:

 - Provide stellar programs, instruction, and student services to achieve timely graduation.

IIQ Highlights

- Provided 439 events.

- Completed the first year of a two-year partnership with the School of Social Work to revise their site-based Master’s of Social Work for blended delivery. Significant progress was made on courses meeting an informal review with two social work courses meeting a formal QM review.
- Hosted the Summer Institute for Online Course Development May 2016 with 19 faculty in attendance.
- Implemented the Online Course Review procedure to ensure courses are in compliance with the United States Department of Education’s definition of a telecommunications course.

The first Online Course Review was conducted in Spring 2016, per the Provost's request. Dissertation, thesis, internships, clinicals, and many graduate courses were not reviewed so the majority of courses reviewed were undergraduate courses. Many courses lacked only one or two items from the Course Review Checklist, such as the textbook ISBN and the expected instructor response time for communications. After the second review, six courses did not meet the checklist items.

Distance Education (2.5 FTE)

Distance Education (DE) provides prospective students a one-stop website to access information about the 39 degree programs offered in non-traditional formats. Compared to FY 15, there was an increase in DE Degree Program inquiries. However, the number of inquiries are still below FY 14. Website email inquiries are answered and directed to the appropriate contact person as needed (distance.nmsu.edu). See Appendix C.

Highlights

- NMSU became a State Authorized Reciprocity Agreement (SARA) institution in June 2015
- There was noticeable increase (49%) in inquiries from 57 (FY15) to 112 (FY16) via email and phone concerning Distance Education Degree Programs.
- Distance Education website updated to new NMSU design interface with a SARA section.
- Additional faculty resources added to the DE website.

Instructional Media Services (2.0 FTE)

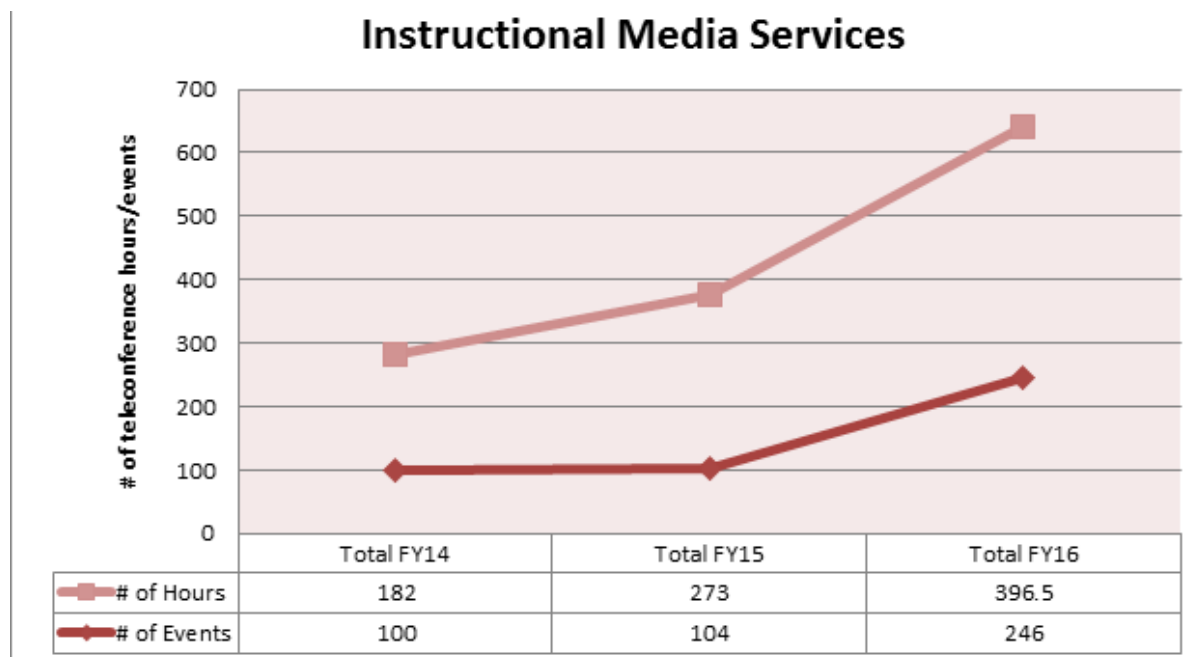
